**SUBJECT:** West 2nd Street Corridor Operation After Action Summary

The purpose of this memo is to provide an overview of the Reno Police Department's focused enforcement efforts conducted in the West 2nd Street Corridor on April 4<sup>th</sup> and April 5<sup>th</sup>. This operation was initiated to reduce criminal activity and increase public safety in one of the city's most active downtown areas.

**Operation Overview**

Dates: April 4, 2025

April 5, 2025

Times: 10:00 p.m. – 4:00 a.m.

Mission Statement: Deploy strategic law enforcement resources in the 2nd Street Corridor to deter violence and criminal behavior, ensuring a safe environment for residents and visitors.

**Summary of Activities**

The Reno Police Department conducted a high-visibility operation along the 2nd Street Corridor to deter violent crime and enhance safety for both residents and patrons in the area. The operation utilized a mix of patrol officers, supervisors, and RTIC (Real-Time Intelligence Center) analysts to ensure effective coverage and coordinated response.

On Friday, April 4, the team included one lieutenant, two sergeants, four officers, and two RTIC analysts. Operations resulted in:

- 8 Traffic Stops (e.g. speeding, failure to signal)

- 9 Vehicle Checks (e.g. suspicious parked vehicle, welfare check on vehicle with hazards on)
- 3 Parking Citations (e.g. parked in a red zone)
- 4 Subject Stops (e.g. individual loitering or other suspicious activity)
- 20 Warnings (e.g. written warning for expired registration or other minor offenses)
- 1 Citizen Hail (e.g. passerby flagged down officer)
- 1 Public Service Call (e.g. officer handled routine call for service)

On Saturday, April 5, the operation was scaled up to include one lieutenant, one sergeant, thirteen officers, and two RTIC analysts. Operations resulted in:

- 20 Traffic Stops (e.g. speeding, failure to signal)
- 2 Business Checks (e.g. communications with operators of local businesses regarding concerns in the area)
- 11 Parking Citations (e.g. parked in a red zone)
- 15 Citations (e.g. various traffic offenses)
- 95 Warnings (e.g. written warning for expired registration or other minor offenses)
- 63 Citizen Contacts (e.g. casual engagement during foot patrol)
- 3 Felony Arrests (e.g. ex-felon in possession of firearm, possession of fentanyl)
- 3 Misdemeanor Arrests (e.g. public intoxication, shoplifting)

In total, personnel logged 71 hours of regular duty time and 95 hours of overtime. The estimated cost for the two-night operation is \$18,121.82.
