SUBJECT: FY 2026 Federal Appropriations for the City of Reno (Community Project Funding Requests Update)

President Donald Trump signed a spending package on Tuesday, February 3 to fund federal government operations and programs through September 2026. Congress passed the package of appropriations bills earlier on Tuesday. The approved bills include direct funding to government and nonprofit entities for specific projects through the Community Project Funding (CPF) process, formerly referred to as earmarks.

With the support and advocacy of Senators Cortez Masto and Rosen as well as Congressman Amodei, the City is set to receive several million dollars for various projects outlined below.

Additionally, several infrastructure projects in Reno will benefit from awards to the City’s regional partners, RTC Washoe and the City of Sparks.

- RTC Washoe partnered with the City of Reno, the City of Sparks, and Washoe County to develop a joint \$6,000,000 proposal to fund local street rehabilitation projects – \$2,000,000 will go towards the Marsh Avenue and Sharon Way neighborhood street rehabilitation project.

- The City of Sparks received an award of \$3,773,000 for phase one design and construction services to acquire backup power systems for the Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility, a shared facility between Reno and Sparks.

Summary of City of Reno Awards

Reno Police Department – Real Time Information Center

The City of Reno Police Department's Real Time Information Center (RTIC) project will allow the Reno Police Department to purchase equipment and software to further enhance the center's ability to embrace intelligence-led policing, provide enhanced information for response or deterrence of calls for service, increased investigatory capability, and overall greater public safety. The proposal to allocate funding for the establishment of a RTIC heralds a significant technological advancement with far-reaching implications for law enforcement operations and public safety. By centralizing data sources and providing real-time situational awareness, the RTIC stands to revolutionize the department's ability to respond effectively to incidents and protect the community it serves.

Evelyn Mount Northeast Community Center – Wellness Remodel

The proposed project includes the modification and remodeling of the aging Evelyn Mount Northeast Community Center to establish a comprehensive whole health and wellness hub catering to the diverse needs of youth, families, and seniors. Located in an area lacking access to these services, this request seeks to modify the center into a vibrant space offering a wide array of amenities and services aimed at fostering physical, mental, and social well-being. The remodel will modify the north wing of the facility to allow increased capacity for wellness programming. The project will remove or modify walls, flooring, HVAC ducts, plumbing, and electrical.
